Education in Uzbekistan is unisex, there is no special schools for boys or girls. Till this academic year, there were dress codes at schools and colleges but there were no strict uniforms that students should wear. From year 2018-2019 The government of Uzbekistan adopted a resolution on a single modern school uniform for state general education institutions. Commenting this decision, the President stated that "School uniforms play a valuable role in contributing to the ethos of schools, support positive behavior, discipline and moral values. Secondly, the lack of uniforms may lead to neglect by pupils from wealthy families towards poorly dressed pupils. When choosing a school, parents rely on their priorities and material capabilities.
